About the K-12 Virtual Academy

Commencing with the 2021-22 school year, the Natomas Unified K-12 Virtual Academy will:

- provide families with an additional school option
- provide teaching and learning in a virtual (online) instructional model for grades K-8
- provide teaching and learning in a virtual (online) independent study / in-person instructional model for grades 9-12
- include flexible scheduling
- assist in retaining students and enrollment growth (Intra/Inter District Transfers)



About the K-12 Virtual Academy

The Academy is intended to:

- be an educational commitment for students who thrive in a virtual learning setting(s)
- be a long term learning alternative to traditional schools
- not be a temporary alternative to the current global pandemic



Intradistrict Transfers

- Each request will be reviewed
- Families will need to decide early if this is a school option for them long term

Can I transfer back to my neighborhood school?

 Like with any intradistrict transfer, a student may request to transfer back and placement may be made if there is space available at his/her neighborhood school



About the K-12 Virtual Academy

The Academy will include:

- A K-8 Virtual Academy a CDE recognized public school that will launch and be located at Bannon Creek School
- A 9-12 Virtual Independent Study and In-Person instructional learning program with a blended learning schedule at Inderkum High School, Natomas High School, and Discovery High School - an expansion of our existing Independent Study Program



Virtual Academy History

- 2017-18: Added flexible scheduling language to the NTA Collective Bargaining Agreement
- September 26, 2018: Resolution 18-24 approved designating Virtual/In-Class Learning program facilities
- Stakeholder engagement e.g. 2020-21 LCAP Survey
- October 31, 2020 MOU with NTA:
 - 5. A Virtual Academy Program or School will be developed to retain students. The school plan will either be developed prior to March 1, 2021 when the Transfer and Reassignment window opens, or as appropriate/necessary, a special Transfer and Reassignment window will be held before the Virtual Academy is staffed. Any item(s) impacted by the implementation of this program that is within the scope of bargaining will be negotiated with NTA.
 - a. A paid committee of equal members of both NTA members and NUSD Leaders will be developed jointly and agreed to before November 16th. Parties will jointly establish how many members will serve on the committee, goals of the committee, and how often the committee will meet.
 - b. Each party will appoint its own committee members, and at no point shall the committee make decisions that are within the scope of negotiations.
 - 4 meetings to date with NTA representatives to discuss concepts

Budget

- Based on an initial 500 student enrollment
- Combination of one-time/bridge funding (initial startup) and ongoing funds
- Staffing and benefits include (est. up to \$2.2M*):
 - Certificated Teachers (up to 16.0 FTE)
 - Executive Director (1.0 FTE)
 - School Secretary III (1.0 FTE)
 - Office Specialist (1.0 FTE)
 - IT Specialist (0.5 FTE)
- Technology, software, subscriptions, supplies, etc. (est. up to \$720k)

^{*}contingent upon internal staff transfers and staffing adjustments. Less startup/bridge costs needed if maximum internal staffing transfers occur


