 In order to fully understand these chapters, it is helpful to understand the jargon, or specific vocabulary, used in court. In court, all people have the right to legal counsel (lawyers to represent them). The plaintiff is the person/group who brings a case against another in court. They accuse them of something. Their lawyer is the prosecuting attorney. All together, this group is known as the prosecution. The defendant is the person/group being accused of something. They are defending themselves from punishment. Their lawyer is the defense attorney. All together, this group is known as the defense. During court, a judge presides over the courtroom proceedings. First, they ask the defendant how they plead: guilty or not guilty. The attorneys give opening arguments to the jury, a panel of people who decide the verdict (outcome) of the case. The bulk of a courtroom trial is examination and cross-examination of witnesses, people who saw or have information regarding the crime. At the end of examinations, attorneys give closing arguments.
