### MESSAGE FROM MRS. SCHULZKUMP

This is a friendly reminder that we will only have 3 gates accessible during arrival and dismissal: The Heron Park gate (opens at 7:45 am), the Minden Gate by the bus lane (opens at 7:45), and the Main Gate by the front office (opens at 7:45).

It is our goal that your children arrive at school and are dismissed from school in a safe, timely, and orderly manner. The safety of your children is our number one priority! Students who are having breakfast report directly to the cafeteria; all other 1-6 grade students must wait in classroom lines until morning recess begins at 8:00am (blacktop only). 7-8 grade students report to the middle school blacktop. TK and Kindergarten students report to classrooms. 1-6 grade students have morning recess from 8:00- 8:10am; 7-8 grade students report to 1<sup>st</sup> Period. Class begins at 8:05am for Middle

Please note that there is no outdoor supervision for students before 8:00am or after 3:00pm. Students that arrive late will need to go to the office and check in prior to going to class.

Please also remember to look out for students biking and walking to school, and for everyone's safety, please only park your car in either a marked parking spot or on the street. Please do not park your car in the middle of the parking lot. This backs up traffic into the street and blocks visibility of students. Remember to not make a u-turn in the middle of the four way stop in front of the school. This is a major safety concern. We have a large number of students and families that walk to and from school. We want everyone to remain safe. Thank you for your cooperation.

## DID YOU KNOW?

→ We are a Responsive Classroom school! Responsive Classroom is an approach to elementary and middle school education that emphasizes social, emotional, and academic growth in a safe school community. More information about the Responsive Classroom approach can be found at

http://www.responsiveclassroom.org. Our STEAM academic focus ensures that students are actively engaged in their learning through inquiry-based science instruction and the integration of technology, engineering, art, and mathematics throughout the day. Our goal is to deliver learning activities that are active, joyful, fun, and appropriately



challenging. Students see how this learning is relevant to their lives and take a personal interest in it.

#### Key Components of Responsive Classroom

- Morning Meeting and Responsive Advisory Meetings: Each TK-6 class gathers together each morning at 8:15AM to greet one another, share news, participate in an activity, and warm up for the day ahead. 7-8 students start each day with Responsive Advisory Meeting at 8:05. Timely arrival to school is extremely important so that all students have the opportunity to be an active participant in the development of their classroom community.
- Rule Creation: Students help create classroom rules that allow all members of the classroom community to reach their learning goals.
- Interactive Modeling: Students are explicitly taught to notice and practice expected behaviors in order to demonstrate and internalize them.
- Positive Teacher Language: Adults use carefully selected, respectful words and tone to promote active learning and self-discipline.
- Collaborative Problem-Solving: Strategies such as conferencing and role-playing are used to help students solve problems and resolve conflict.
- Logical Consequences: Adults respond to misbehavior in a way that respects children, guides them to recognize the effects of their actions, and helps them develop internal controls.
- Classroom Organization: The physical space is carefully structured in ways that encourage independence, cooperation, and productivity.
- Guided Discovery: Materials are introduced in a way that encourages discovery and creativity.
- Academic Choice: Teacher-structured choices are provided to students to help increase motivation, self-direction, and learning.
- Working with Families: Family partnerships are essential. Families are invited to share insights and are collaborative partners in their child's education.

# Arrival and Dismissal:

It is our goal that your children arrive at school and are dismissed from school in a safe, timely, and orderly manner. The safety of your children is our number one priority! . Students who are having breakfast report directly to the cafeteria; all other 1-6 grade students must wait in classroom lines until morning recess begins at 8:00am (blacktop only). 7-8 grade students report to the middle school blacktop. TK and Kindergarten students report to classrooms. 1-6 grade students have morning recess from 8:00- 8:10am; 7-8 grade students report to 1<sup>st</sup> Period. Class begins at 8:05am for Middle School and at 8:15am for TK-6. Dismissal is at 2:08 pm for TK and Kindergarten (Pick up from classroom), 2:25pm for Grades 1-6, and 2:50pm for Grades 7- 8. There is no outdoor supervision for students before 8:00am or after 3:00pm. Students that arrive late will need to go to the office and check in prior to going to class.

# **COVID Exposure Notifications and Protocols**

The County Department of Public Health has been making frequent adjustments to guidelines to keep up with the surge, and we are doing our best to help our students and staff stay healthy while still keeping our main focus on our students and their academic, social emotional needs, and personal safety. You are going to see some change in how COVID cases are communicated and responded to at our school, including the following:

- 1) If there is a positive case in your child's classroom, the entire class will now be automatically notified of the potential exposure. You'll have to determine if your child was exposed based on the date the positive individual was last at school.
- 2) You will still have options to quarantine your child or have them tested due to an exposure, but we will no longer be testing all close contacts at school multiple times. If you would like your child tested, you can utilize a home test or one of the many testing options available, including testing office hours at Heron every day from 1:00-3:00. We now have a link on our website for you to sign up for a time if you would like to have your child tested at school. https://natomasunified.org/hes/
- 3) The exception to this will be if a particular classroom or cohort has an outbreak, defined by 3 or more cases in a 14-day period. Those classrooms will be disinfected and all students not in quarantine will be required to be tested at school once a week until there is no longer an outbreak.
- 4) If there is a positive COVID case in your household, all students and staff who are vaccinated can continue to come to school as long as they are negative and do not have symptoms. However, they must take a test on the 5th day after exposure to ensure they are still negative. If students and staff are not vaccinated, they will need to quarantine at home and take a test on Day 5 to return. If you do not wish to be tested, they must quarantine for the full IO days.
- 5) If a student or staff member tests positive, they must stay at home for a minimum of 5 days, testing on the 5th day and returning the next day if the test is negative and they have no symptoms. Otherwise, the positive individual must quarantine at home for the full 10 days



# Lunch Deliveries: Parents Must Report to School Office to Deliver Lunch - Food Delivery Services Not Allowed

Please be aware that if you are delivering lunch to your child, you still must come to the front office and check in as a visitor. Parents may not deliver food to their students directly at the gate outside. Students are not allowed to share food, so please be advised that parents may not bring large quantities of food intended for your child to share with others at lunch. Food delivery services such as DoorDash are NOT accepted in the office and will be turned away.

→ Parking Lot Safety- Please only park your car on the street or in a MARKED PARKING SPACE. Please do not leave your car parked and unattended in the middle of the parking lot. This blocks other drivers in and backs up the parking lot into the street. Most importantly, it limits visibility of students and creates a dangerous situation. Please remember the the bus lane on Minden is reserved for our school



busses only; that may not be used for pick up or drop off.

## Away For the Day Cell Phone Policy

 In order to minimize distractions, foster student communication and collaboration, and protect students' privacy at school, we follow an "Away For the Day" cell phone policy at Heron. Cell phones, smart watches, or other communication and listening devices may not be used during the instructional school day, including during passing periods and lunch. If you feel your child must have a cell phone, it must remain away for the day and be TURNED OFF from the first bell in the morning until after the dismissal bell in the afternoon. Texting and filming are not permitted anytime during the school day, except for a valid instructional purpose determined by a teacher. Any device with a camera, video, or voice recording function shall not be used in any manner which infringes on the privacy rights of any other person. • Failure to follow these guidelines will result in confiscation of the phone and/or detention. The cell phone may be retrieved by the student at the end of the day on the first offense, and will only be returned to a parent or guardian for further offenses. Parents and guardians who need to communicate with their child during the school day should call the main office at (916) 567-568O. It is not advisable to send your child to school with a costly cell phone, as the school is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged cell phones. ### Dress Code

Board Policy 5132(a) : The Board of Trustees believes that appropriate dress and grooming contribute to a productive learning environment. The Board expects students to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to wear clothes that are suitable for the school activities in which they participate. Students' clothing may not present a health or safety hazard or create a distraction which would interfere with the educational process. Students and parents/guardians shall be informed about dress and grooming standards at the beginning of the year and whenever these standards are revised.

- All clothing must be clean, suitable, and appropriate for school activities, including PE and recess.
- Shirts should be long enough to cover bellies when hands are raised.
- Undergarments should not be visible
- Pants, shorts and skirts must be fit around the waist; no sagging. Shorts and skirts should not be inappropriately short.
- Shoes must be tie or strap-on and suitable for running and other recess or PE activities. Flip Flops are not allowed.
- Hats may be worn for sun protection outside; hats are to be removed inside all buildings.
- All clothing should be free of "put downs" or other forms of language contrary to supporting academics and student success. Clothing that contains images of violence, is known by local law enforcement to be gang related, is distracting to the learning environment, promotes or glorifies drugs or violence is strictly prohibited. Students wearing such clothing will be asked to call home for a change of clothes or required to change into clothing provided by the school.

HERON SCHOOL ATHLETIC PROGRAM Parent Information 2022-23

Thank you for your interest in having your student participate in our athletic program! We look forward to seeing our students compete and enjoy learning and playing sports here at Heron. Our sports program is for 4th-8th grade students.

Each year the Natomas Unified School District requires that each student have a Student Athlete Clearance Packet completed prior to being eligible to tryout or participate in a school-sponsored sports program. Part of the clearance packet is a physical form that needs to be signed by your child's physician. It is very important that you plan ahead to have this completed by the posted deadlines.\*

As we approach each sport a permission slip will be available for your student to take home to have you sign showing your authorization to participate. This permission form is required for each sport that your child would like to participate in. The Student Athlete Clearance Packet is only completed once per year and is due by the deadline of the first sport your child plays. All packets and permission slips are to be turned in to the Kerry House in the school office. Only fully completed packets will be accepted.

Completed Student Athlete Clearance Packets can be turned in anytime after the first day of school.
