WHY INDERKUM HIGH SCHOOL?

Inderkum High is an International Baccalaureate (IB) rigorous academic setting committed to producing students who read carefully, think critically, and work together to improve the local and global community. Inderkum graduates will be ready to lead after high school by being proficient in core academics, critical, reflective thinkers, collaborative workers, and effective citizens. Inderkum High School is in partnership with Natomas Middle School for the Middle Years Programme (MYP), which uses a rigorous IB education to all 9th- and 10th-grade students. The Diploma Programme (DP) is a world-class option recognized by top universities for students who continue IB in the 11th and 12th grades.

HOW DO I KNOW IF INDERKUM IS RIGHT FOR MY STUDENT?

Inderkum is a comprehensive high school with rigorous academic options and award-winning music, athletics, arts, and student activity programs. Students have many opportunities to develop skills and explore interests as they prepare for college and career. Students participate in service learning and a final senior project, allowing them to pursue personal interests while experiencing community and civic engagement. If you want to be a well-rounded global citizen, Inderkum is the right high school for you.

Academic program options include:


- 1. Dual Enrollment California Early College Academy (CECA) is a college readiness pathway designed to help students in the academic middle who are capable of completing a college preparatory path with the support of the AVID elective. Upon passage of the American River College placement exam, students can graduate with a full year (or more) of UC/CSU transferable college credits through American River -- at no cost to the student.
- 2. Broadcast Media Pathway introduces students to broadcasting and helps develop communication skills, team collaboration, news writing, video, and editing techniques. All students are eligible.
- 3. In partnership with the Sacramento Police Department and the Sacramento Fire Department, the **Public Safety Pathway** is designed to provide a rigorous academic program and career preparation for those interested in law enforcement and firefighting related fields.
- 4. Students intending to pursue an IB Diploma or multiple IB certificates should apply for IB Scholars classes in grades 9 & 10. Scholars classes are accelerated and more in-depth, so students will be ready for the rigors of IB's Diploma program in 11th grade. Each academic option provides Inderkum students with the opportunity to graduate with a resume that might include Advanced Placement Courses, A-G eligibility, and college credits.
