Grading Policy

Students will receive two report cards. One report card will be a letter grade report card which all students attending NMS receives. Please note that I do grade students accordingly and they will receive letter grades "A-F" as it correlates with their IEP goals and assignments. For example, if your child receives an "A", it is because at that time they demonstrated they have met their IEP goal and have turned in class assignments with majority of the assignments being accurate. If

your child has anything lower than an "A" (B, C, D, F), it will demonstrate they have not met their IEP goal and may not have turned in their classroom assignments or may not have scored accurately on assignments.

When school wide report cards are sent home, I also will send home an updated goal page of the IEP so you can see specifically where your child stands with his/her measurable annual goals agreed upon at the IEP meetings.

Curriculum

During the school year, we will be working from Unique Curriculum; some of you may be aware of this program already. Unique is a program which is being used in all of the SpEd classrooms within the district. It allows for all core subjects such as Math, ELA, Science, Social Studies, and Living Skills to be individualized for the individual need and skill level of your child. Each unit is aligned with Common Core State Standards.

Outside of Unique, we will be working on skills such as laundry (sorting, folding, hanging clothes) as well as loading and unloading the washer and dryer machines. We will also be working on resume building, filling out job applications, mock job interviews, washing dishes, baking/cooking, and other essential daily functions which promotes independence.

Homework

Homework may be given occasionally. If you child is absent, I will send homework home for them to complete (for distance learning homework can be found in the google classroom). They will have 3 days from the date they return to school to complete assignments and return them back to me for full credit. Anything returned later than 3 days will not be accepted. I will also send home any work your child did not complete during that day of instruction so they do not fall behind (for distance learning classwork can be found in the google classroom). In that case, I will make a note on the assignment informing you that the classwork is incomplete and now homework for the day. In those instances, please return the work the following day for full credit, otherwise they will receive no credit (0) for the assignment as it will be considered late.
