Course Overview: This is a 2-year course for students on an accelerated path to high school mathematics. Year 1 will include all of the 7th grade curriculum and the 8th grade curriculum. Year 2 will include one unit of the 8th grade curriculum plus all of the Integrated Math 1 curriculum. As freshman in high school, students will continue on the accelerated pathway into Integrated Math 2 or Integrated Math 2 Plus.

The Common Core State Standards in Mathematics serve as important benchmarks to ensure that all students are receiving high-quality education and are well prepared for success in post-secondary education and the workforce. The standards for middle school mathematics provide a coherent and rich preparation for high school mathematics.

The required text is <u>California Go Math</u> Middle School Accelerated Grade 7. Materials: Supplementary material will be used in class based upon the learning needs of the students. Suggested materials to have in class every day:

- ✓ Composition Notebook (100 pages) or Spiral Notebook just for math - the notes are designed for a composition book

Academic Expectations: The best way to be successful in math class is to:

- Complete and turn in assignments on time.
- Keep trying and learn by doing.
